

GWADAR DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY ACT

- Gwadar Development Authority came into existence under an ACT of Provincial Parliament in 2003:
 - Mandated "CONTROLLED AREA" is Tehsil Gwadar
 - Planning, development, improvement and construction of Gwadar City
 - Prepare, implement and regulate Gwadar Master Plan and its land use
 - Implement town planning, building control and environmental regulations
 - Prevent haphazard growth of city and buildings
 - GDA Town Planning and Building Control Regulations were promulgated in 2004 - 05

GDA ORGANOGRAM




History of Gwadar: Door of Wind

- Part of Gedrosia (Mekran) satrapy of Achaeminids Persian Empire (550 BC-330 BC)
- Fell to Greek General Seleucus Nicator in 312 BC
- Became part of Maurya Empire in 303 BC
- Captured by Arab-Muslim army in 643 AD
- Mir Naseer Khan Noori captured Gwadar in middle of 18th century
- □ In 1783 Mir Naseer Khan Noori handed over Gwadar, as part of his share of revenues, to Saiad Sultan a omani prince who took refuge in Gwadar after falling out with his brothers with the understanding that the area be returned to Kalat.
- Saiad Sultan ascended to the throne of Muscat in 1797 but never returned Gwadar to Kalat.
- □ 1958 Pakistan purchased Gwadar enclave from Oman for \$1M

Gwadar, Pakistan — the most important city you've never heard of

The world's "busiest and most important interstate," journalist Robert D. Kaplan says, is the Indian Ocean, with 50% of all container trafficand 70% of all petroleum traffic traversing its waters. It is this region — with China and India jockeying for dominance, the United States trying to maintain its influence and unstable regimes threatening the flow of resources — that will be the setting for most of the global conflicts in the coming decades.


In his new book, "Monsoon: The Indian Ocean and the Future of American Power" (Random House), Kaplan notes that US leaders already realize this, with the Navy suggesting that it will not have a forward operating presence in the Atlantic, shifting to this area instead. But the battle for the Indian Ocean will not be like the conflicts of the past. China, for instance, will not be a straightforward foe like the Soviet Union.

"The real lesson here is the subtlety of the world we're entering, of which the Indian Ocean provides a salient demonstration," Kaplan says. "Instead of the hardened military bases of the Cold War and earlier epochs, there will be dual-use civilian-military facilities where basing arrangements will be implicit rather than explicit." Here, Kaplan runs down the region, including the little-known city that could loom large:

Gwadar

At the intersection of empires, the port city of Gwadar "could become the new silk route nexus," Kaplan says, but that's all tied to Fakistan's struggle against becoming a failed state. The Middle Eastern nation of Oman heid Gwadar until 1958, when it was ceded to the newly formed Pakistan. Russia coveted it as a port during its long war in Afghanistan. Meanwhile, two local ethnic groups, the Baluch and the Sindhi, battle for their own independent nations. Now the Chinese are funding a






TRADITIONAL TRADING ROUTE FOR ASIAN INDUSTRIALISED NATIONS



TRADING ROUTE AS CONCEIVED THROUGH PAKISTAN




GWADAR MASTER PLAN

 - On direction of Honorable PM, the Gwadar Master Plan is being reviewed to develop Gwadar as a Smart Port City




FUTURE GWADAR Resort Area

Preferential Tax Policy

- FBR and BOI are in process of finalizing a preferential tax policy
- Exemption of custom duty on import of machinery, equipment and other items for setting up power plants, water plants and other infrastructure projects within a radius of 30 km
- Exemption of whole custom duty for concession holder for construction and operation of Gwadar port and development of free zone for import of material and equipment, not manufactured locally
- Import of raw material and export are exempted in Free Zone











ECC approves 700km LNG pipeline project

ISLAMABAD: The Economic Coordination Committee (ECC) of the cabinet on Thursday approved construction of 700km Gwadar-Nawabshah pipeline to transport liquefied natural gas (LNG). The pipeline would also facilitate Iran-Pakistan pipeline project if international sanctions on Tehran go.

The meeting presided over by Finance Minister Ishaq Dar approved the Gwadar-Nawabshah LNG Terminal and Pipeline Project under which a 700km pipeline of 42inch diameter would be laid along with two compressor stations.

The terminal will have the capacity to handle up to 500 million cubic feet per day (mmcfd) of gas.




